Place value (within 20)

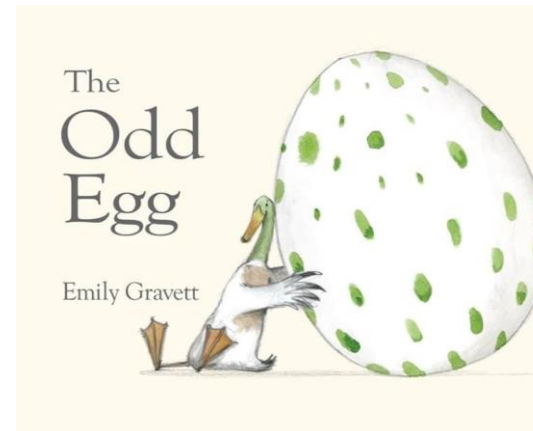
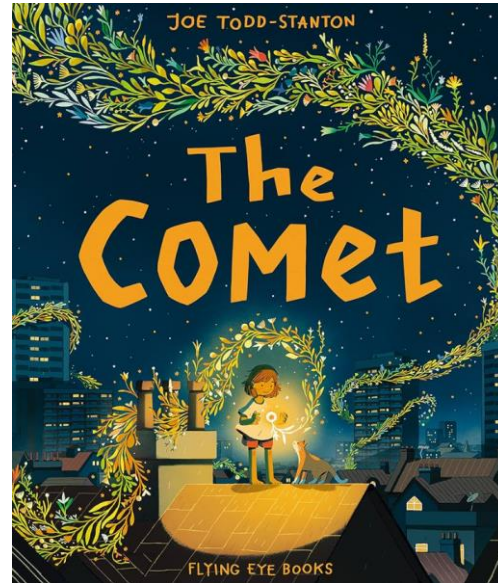
- Read and write numbers from 1 to 20 in numerals and words
  - Count forwards and backwards from any given number
  - Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations
- Addition and subtraction (within 20)
- Represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20
  - Add and subtract one-digit and two-digit numbers to 20, including zero
  - Solve one-step problems and missing number problems

### Science: Identifying Plants

- Identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees
- Identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees
- Compare and contrast findings about different plants

### English

- Discuss word meanings
- Build up fluency and confidence in word reading
- Capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks to demarcate sentences
- Expanded noun phrases for description and specification
- Compose sentences orally before writing
- Sequence sentences to form short narratives
- Read aloud own writing
- Apostrophes to mark where letters are missing in spelling and to mark singular possession in nouns
- How the prefix un- changes the meaning of verbs and adjectives



### Geography: Around the World

- Know that the lines within a map denote country borders
- Locate the seven continents on a world map
- Identify and describe some key human and physical features of countries in each of the continents
- Use words such as city, beach, mountain and lake to describe features of a place
- Know that some countries are hot countries and some countries are cold countries

### RE: Surrey Syllabus
