Dear Parents,

While your children are at home it is important that they keep reading. For this reason your children have come home with extra books today.

Your children should continue to learn spellings and have their homework to complete.

If you are looking for extra activities I would suggest that your child could write a diary or send e-mails to friends under your supervision. You will then see which spellings they need to work on.

We have heard of a parent who has set up a type of treat/tuck shop to encourage their children to practise adding and subtracting as they give their child a set amount of money each day and have priced activities and snacks so the child can decide what to spend their money on e.g apple 5p, biscuit 10p, lego time, 20p etc. This is a great activity as you can set it to suit your child and it is a fun way for them to learn.

Also practise times tables, $\times 2, \times 5, \times 10, \times 3$ and number bonds to 20 e.g $2+18=20$, $3+17=20, 2+8=10, 3+7=10$ etc.

A large part of our summer term science learning is a focus on plants and growing. If you are able to use your garden or local park to observe or even plant and grow your own. Cress seeds are easy, quick and fun. Also growing a beanstalk is exciting.
